More than 1,000 acres on the island have been protected by the **St. Simons Land Trust**, an accredited member of the national Land Trust Alliance.

This includes Cannon's Point Preserve, with its 608 acres of undeveloped wilderness, intact maritime forest, and more than six miles of peninsula shoreline

on the north-end of the island. The 258-acre Guale Preserve features Polly's Trail in the center of the property and Janet's Trail at the waterfront. And across the island are protected areas that provide intimate access to historic, cultural, and environmental features and memorable experiences for birders, hikers, bikers, kayakers, photographers, and all nature lovers.

As the Land Trust marks its 20th anniversary this year, we celebrate the residents, businesses, and visitors who have helped to create a culture of conservation on St. Simons. what's the best beach for you? Let this guide to the area's amenities lead the way.

FAMILY FUN

If you're taking the whole family to the beach and making a day of it, you might be looking for more than just sun and sand. St. Simons Island's Massengale Park has a shaded picnic area and playground with easy beach access, while Coast Guard Station offers plenty of parking and facilities, plus a wide section of beach. On Jekyll Island, Great Dunes is conveniently located near playgrounds, mini-golf, bike, and Segway rentals. Oceanview Beach Park offers pavilions with picnic tables and grills.

FISHING & WILDLIFE

If your idea of a good time at the beach is more about observing our ecosystem and interacting with nature, head to St. Simons Island's **Gould's**Inlet for fishing, bird watching, and spectacular sunrises; explore Jekyll Island's beautiful **Driftwood Beach**; or take in the sights at **South Dunes Beach**'s observation deck and freshwater pond. If you're on the beaches at low tide, explore the tidal pools for hermit crabs, horseshoe crabs, and sand dollars—but please leave them where you found them.

PEACE & QUIET

These picturesque beaches are popular among locals and visitors alike, but if you are looking for a little more solitude, **Gould's Inlet**, **Driftwood Beach**, and **Glory Beach** are known as quieter spots. For the ultimate in privacy, resort guests enjoy Little St. Simons Island and Sea Island.

DISABLED ACCESSIBILITY

Jekyll Island has beach accessibility for people with physical disabilities at **St. Andrews Beach**, **Great Dunes** (crossover No. 32), and **Beach Village** (crossover No. 38), as well as free delivery and pick-up of beach-going wheelchairs. **Coast Guard Station** at East Beach and **Massengale Park** on St. Simons Island also offer beach access via ADA accessible mats.

BEACH SAFETY

Lifeguards are present from Memorial Day to Labor Day, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily at **Coast Guard Station** and **Massengale Park** beaches on St. Simons Island. Swim at your own risk. **Do not swim to visible sand bars.** The tide changes quickly and will submerge the sandbar, stranding swimmers in deep water. Rip currents can occur in most ocean environments at any time. Find tide charts and more information at **Goldenisles.com**.

THE MAJESTIC TREE SPIRITS

On the hunt for St. Simons Island's seven treasured carvings.

THE STORY OF CORA, PROTECTOR OF THE LOGGERHEADS

egend holds that a spellbinding beauty named Cora has lived in the depths of the Golden Isles for centuries. Part human, part fish, mermaid Cora has rarely been sighted by islanders. But those who have managed to catch a glimpse of her gliding through the currents never forget her splendor and grace.

Her sun-kissed skin is golden brown, her green eyes sparkle like emeralds, and her chocolate-hued hair falls in ribbons down to her waist. But Cora's true beauty shines from within: She is the gentle protector of the islands' loggerhead turtles. When a mother loggerhead lays her eggs on the sand, she hums a sweet song only her babies can hear. When the babies are ready to hatch, Cora waits at the shoreline. She hums their mother's song, patiently guiding them to the water.

When the hatchlings reach her, Cora leads them out to sea to begin their new lives. Along the way, she guards them from fishing nets, teaches them to become strong swimmers, and shows them how to eat conchs and crabs. When they've become independent enough to find their own ways, Cora leaves the turtles to await the next newborns.

Golden Isles Welcome Center On nights when the moon is full, you may see the reflection of Cora's tail in the water. And if you glance at the surf when the last baby loggerhead has journeyed down the beach, you'll see a flash of Cora's tail as she dives back under the waves.



If you look closely at some of the majestic oak trees that cover St. Simons Island, it's possible to find one gazing back at you. Either peering out from the trunk or perhaps from the stub of a long-vanished branch, the unmistakable image of a weathered face would be one of the island's 20 commissioned Tree Spirits. Using gouges and a mallet, sculptor Keith Jennings began carving these beloved creatures in 1982.

While there are seven tree spirits in public areas, the most popular is the majestic Mermaid Tree Spirit at the Golden Isles Welcome Center. Visit Cora and pick up a map of the other Tree Spirit locations at one of our Welcome Centers.

WHEN DAWN BREAKS

IN THE GOLDEN ISLES,

explorers are immersed in its natural beauty. Anglers and shrimpers set out on the water, bikers travel meandering paths, and sea turtles attract admirers to the beaches. Birders spot new species, adventurers rent paddleboards, and families picnic in picture-perfect parks. Whether you're seeking the sound of silence or getting hooked on a new hobby, there are outdoor options for all.

PEDAL POWER

iles of bike paths connect scenic points of interest along the **St. Simons Island** and **Jekyll Island Trail Systems**, giving visitors the chance to explore the Golden Isles at a leisurely pace, and allowing cyclists an opportunity to get in a workout surrounded by the region's charm and beauty.

Meander through the village of St. Simons Island or venture down its residential streets to get a better feel for daily life in the Golden Isles. Pedal through maritime forests and across vast expanses of salt marshes, stopping along the way to snap a selfie with a beautiful backdrop or soak up the rich history that surrounds you at any number of historical sites along the trails. Hop off the beaten path for a ride along one of the idyllic beaches or brave more rugged terrain on the off-road bike trails in **Blythe Island Regional Park** in Brunswick or in the wilderness of **Cannon's Point Preserve** on St. Simons Island.

Even better: There's no need for casual cyclists to worry about loading up gear for the trip — bicycle rental companies, such as **Island Bicycles** on St. Simons Island, offer a full range of options for the whole family, including pull-behind trailers for the little ones. Before you set out, be sure to pick up a bike map at the Golden Isles Welcome Center.



INTO THE WILD

he remote location of Georgia's Golden Isles have long protected the ecosystems and creatures that call them home, saving them from overdevelopment and loss of habitat. Countless species of birds, reptiles, and mammals live along the 100 miles of Georgia coastline.

Little St. Simons Island, an eco-resort on a private island, has unparalleled opportunities to get up close with coastal wildlife Naturalist-led tours are a part of the offerings for overnight guests and day visitors, which visit untouched beaches, elevated platforms overlooking the marshes and rookeries, and tree-lined sandy forests.

PARK IT

hether you're looking for a spot to sit and take in one of the painted sunsets or an area for the family to burn off some energy, the Golden Isles is dotted with scenic public parks.

On St. Simons Island, **Gascoigne Bluff** is situated on a rich historic site and features a six-hole disc golf course that winds through a live oak grove as well as the **Southeast Georgia Health System Fitness Trail** and a public fishing pier and floating dock. **Massengale Park** provides an oak-shaded picnic area with barbecue grills and a children's playground, as well as easy access to East Beach.

For more adventurous visitors looking to get into nature, **Cannon's Point Preserve** on the north end of St. Simons Island boasts a primitive wilderness experience. The 600-acre tract of green space features wild native species, numerous shell rings that are more than 4,000 years old, and plantation ruins that date to the 19th century.

Visitors to Jekyll Island will want to pack a picnic lunch to enjoy at **Great Dunes Park** while you take a break from fun in the sun.


And in Brunswick, **Mary Ross Waterfront Park** is a perfect place to view the sunset across the marshes as well as watch shrimp boats and large oceangoing ships from the waterfront docks. Each week, it's the site of the Brunswick Bazaar and Farmer's Market. The park also features a scale model of a Liberty Ship similar to those built in Brunswick's shipyards during World War II.

TAKE FLIGHT

B irders are encouraged to bring their binoculars and eagle eyes to the Golden Isles, as you never know what you might see! More than 330 species can be found among the marshes shaded by oak trees, including herons, egrets, roseate spoonbills and bald eagles.

The **Colonial Coast Birding Trail** is a network of 18 stops from Savannah in the north to St. Marys in the south, each offering a different viewpoint. Included are state parks and sites like **Hofwyl-Broadfield Plantation** in Brunswick, an 1800s rice plantation. Don't miss the nature trail from the visitor's center that follows along the marsh's edge.

The Audubon Society has recognized Jekyll and Little St. Simons islands for their bird habitats. Hundreds of species have been spotted on **Little St. Simons Island**, which hosts annual birding days, evening owl prowls, and more at its nature sanctuary along the Atlantic Migratory Flyway. Brunswick also has opportunities for spotting friendly fowl. **Altama Plantation Wildlife Management Area** is one of the most ecologically diverse habitats in the southeast and boasts the highest documented number of rare plants, animals, and natural community occurrences in Georgia.

SEA THE TURTLES

he Golden Isles' most iconic species is its sea turtles, the most common of which is the loggerhead. One of the most memorable animal encounters is watching hatchlings make their ways from the shore nests to the ocean. Local loggerheads most commonly lay their eggs in early summer, with baby turtles hatching 60 days later, typically July through September. Loggerhead sea turtles are a protected species in Georgia, so be sure to adhere to the posted signs warning you of nesting areas.

Jekyll Island is easily one of the coast's best places to learn about sea turtles as it's where many come to nest. The Georgia Sea Turtle Center is Georgia's only hospital for turtle treatment and rehabilitation, and it features many exhibits on marine life.

"Jekyll Island is one of the few islands that still has some intact maritime forest and beaches, so the wildlife on the island is amazing, from sea turtles to birds to bobcats," says Dr. Terry Norton, veterinarian and director of the Georgia Sea Turtle Center.

ON THE WATER

he best way to experience the landscapes of coastal Georgia is by its waterways, the interconnected rivers and estuaries that link to the Atlantic Ocean. Bring your own boat to dock in one of the many marinas or rent a kayak for the afternoon to explore on your own. Boat ramps are set throughout the isles, including public access spots on the McKay River near St. Simons Island, Sidney Lanier Park in Brunswick, and at Fancy Bluff Creek on Jekyll Island.

Dolphin-watching cruises leave from Jekyll and St. Simons islands, as well as Brunswick, and allow you to see much more than dolphins. Charter an offshore fishing excursion or catch your supper from the comfort of the

pier on St. Simons Island. Crabbing is another popular coastal activity — just be sure to get a fishing license before you go! Bait and tackle shops in Brunswick, St. Simons Island, and Jekyll Island can set you up with all the

If you're looking for something a bit more active, kayak and paddleboard rentals let visitors combine sightseeing with fitness. Enjoy the calm waters of the smaller inlets, which are best for beginners to watersports. Rentals and tours are available from **Southeast Adventure Outfitters** or **Kingfisher Paddleventures** throughout the Golden Isles.







≺he World War II Home **Front Museum** brings to life L Coastal Georgia's extraordinary contributions to winning World War II Immersive exhibits show iconic Home Front scenes such as war bond drives and food rationing. Visitors of all ages can try their hand at plane spotting, directing fighter pilot squadrons using radar technology, and building and tracking the voyages of a Liberty ship. Learn about a devastating attack on April 8, 1942, when German U-boat 123 torpedoed two American tankers just 13 miles off the coast of St. Simons Island, killing 22 mariners. Hear dramatic accounts by Naval Air Station Glynco aviators who piloted the airships that escorted supply convoys along the Atlantic coast. Listen to first-hand accounts of women welders who helped build the enormous Liberty Ships essential to supplying the troops overseas.

The Museum is located in the Historic

Coast Guard Station which housed the local Coast Guard from 1936-1995. The building became an active part of the U.S. War Department in 1941 and is itself a major artifact of the Home Front story. coastalgeorgiahistory.org 912.634.7098

▲ BLOODY MARSH BATTLE SITE

On July 7, 1742, an outnumbered force of British troops ambushed and defeated Spanish troops, halting a planned attack on Fort Frederica. Markers and information panels at this outdoor observation site explain the battle, which once and for all ended Spain's claim to the Georgia territory.

▲ FORT FREDERICA

Fort Frederica was built to help protect General James Oglethorpe's new Georgia colony from the Spanish in Florida. Now a National Monument, visitors are welcome at the fort year-round. The park visitor center features exhibits and a short film.

HISTORY TIMELINE

The Golden Isles formed following the **PLEISTOCENE ICE AGE**. Larger islands, such as St. Simons Island, are estimated to be 35,000 – 40,000 years old. Smaller islands, like Little St. Simons Island, were formed from the larger islands and are about 5,000 – 7,000 years old.

✓ CANNON'S POINT PRESERVE

The oldest remains on this world-class complex of archaeological sites are the numerous shell middens that date back to 2500 B.C. HAMILTON PLANTATION TABBY SLAVE CABINS

Two tabby slave cabins built on Hamilton Plantation remain today at Gascoigne Bluff near Epworth by the Sea. LOVELY LANE CHAPEL >

1754

Following the military successes on St. Simons Island, England signed a **PEACE TREATY** with Spain. British troops were withdrawn from Fort Frederica. A fire in 1758 badly damaged the town of Frederica, and it eventually became a lost town.



▲ ST. SIMONS LIGHTHOUSE MUSEUM

Located near the village and pier, this is one of only five surviving light towers in Georgia. Experience St. Simons Island's most iconic landmark as you climb the 129 steps to be rewarded by breathtaking views of the Golden Isles.

Historically, the oak-laden Gascoigne Bluff had been the location of a Sea Island cotton plantation, the site of a lumber mill, and a shipping point for timber. Today, Gascoigne Bluff is the location of two historic slave cabins and a public park. **Arthur J. Moore Dr.**



1810

The first ST. SIMONS LIGHTHOUSE was completed. Built by James Gould, the original lighthouse stood 85 feet tall and its base was made of tabby, part of which probably came from the ruins at Frederica. This lighthouse was later destroyed by Confederate troops during the Civil War to prevent Union forces from using it to navigate the coast. The current lighthouse was built in 1872 and still serves as an active aid to navigation.



HISTORICAL HARRINGTON SCHOOL CULTURAL CENTER ➤

The last African-American school on St. Simons Island, the Harrington School is the most valuable venue to interpret the island's Gullah-Geechee heritage. The restoration of the school was completed in 2017. To schedule tours for a historic journey into the heart of the Gullah-Geechee communities on the island, contact the St. Simons African American Heritage Coalition.

▲ WORLD WAR II **HOME FRONT MUSEUM**

1820

CHRIST CHURCH, chartered in 1808, was built near the site of Fort Frederica. The church was badly damaged during the Civil War. Anson Dodge Jr. rebuilt it in 1884 as a memorial to his first wife, who died in India on their honeymoon.



1790s - 1861

During the plantation period, St. Simons Island had 10 to 14 plantations. These properties, like HOFWYL-BROADFIELD PLANTATION, were also found in Brunswick and Jekvll Island, and produced rice, cotton, sugar, and other agricultural products. In 1913 Hofwyl-Broadfield Plantation transitioned from rice to a dairy farm. Still standing today, it is open to the public for tours.

1736

FORT FREDERICA and the town of Frederica was established by British General James Oglethorpe on the west side of St. Simons Island. A second fort, Fort St. Simons, was built a few years later near the present-day lighthouse and pier area.





Jekyll Island

THE HISTORIC DISTRICT

Iekvll Island National Historic Landmark District is one of the largest historic districts in the country, with its 240-acre site and 34 historic structures. In the early 1900s, it was the grounds for the world's most exclusive club, today known as the Jekyll Island Club Resort. Riverview Dr.

A HORTON HOUSE

The Horton House is one of the oldest tabby buildings in Georgia. Major William Horton constructed this home in 1743. It has won an Excellence in Preservation award from the Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation. 1145 Riverview Dr.

FAITH CHAPEL ▼

Faith Chapel, built in 1904, served as a nondenominational chapel for members of the Jekyll Island Club. The simple design reflects the relaxed feel of the island. 1858

THE WANDERER, the last ship to smuggle enslaved people from West Africa to America, made landfall on Jekyll Island. Congress passed the Slave Importation Act in 1807, making slave importation illegal. The Wanderer, a sailing vessel known for its high speed, was secretly converted into a slave ship. The ship arrived on Jekyll Island with 409 slaves, and news rapidly spread. The ship owners were taken to federal court, but prosecutors were unable to prove the case, resulting in a not-quilty verdict.

1859

FIRST AFRICAN BAPTIST

CHURCH was organized at Pike's Bluff Plantation on St. Simons Island. At most plantations across the South, slaves were prohibited from practicing religion. However, slaves on St. Simons Island had the opportunity to form a church and congregate regularly. Slaves from the island's plantations attended First African Baptist Church each Sunday. The church can be visited at 5800 Frederica Road, St. Simons Island.



1886

The elite JEKYLL ISLAND CLUB was established after the island was purchased for \$125,000. The Club was built by 1887 and opened its doors to the Pulitzers, Rockefellers, Goodyears, Morgans, and the like. The rich and famous enjoyed Jekyll Island each year from Christmas to Easter until the start of World War II. The state of Georgia bought the island in 1947.

▲ THE RITZ THEATRE

Built in 1899. The Ritz Theatre has been fully restored and serves as a theater and arts center featuring year-round live performances, films, exhibits, educational programs, and more. Current films and exhibits can be found online.

¥ HOFWYL-BROADFIELD PLANTATION

F.J. TORRAS CAUSEWAY was built, connecting Brunswick and St. Simons Island. The series of bridges were designed by Brunswick native Fernando Joseph Torras, who also served as Brunswick's city manager for more than 30 years.

During World War II, BRUNSWICK'S SHIPYARDS


bustled with activity critical to America's war efforts. Approximately 16,000 workers were employed to build 99 Liberty Ships. NAS Glynco, now the site of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, began


> producing blimps to escort U.S. cargo ships through the Atlantic Ocean. The base featured two giant wooden hangers, each about the size of six football fields, and was the only naval air station to accommodate all types of aircraft — blimps, propeller planes, jets, and helicopters. NAS Glynco was decommissioned in 1974.



THE CLOISTER AT SEA ISLAND opened. Howard Coffin purchased the island in 1926

and hired renowned architect Addison Mizner to design the original Cloister Hotel. The Plantation Course at Sea Island Golf Club opened in summer 1927.





he tidal marshes in the Golden Isles created an ideal location for rice and cotton production and made these barrier islands a major player in both industries. After the Revolutionary War victory, plantations flourished in the South, and the Golden Isles area was no exception. On St. Simons Island alone, there were up to 14 different plantations sustained by slave labor.

Slaves from West Africa had valuable knowledge about rice farming and were brought to the area to transform the marshy swamps into cultivated rice and cotton fields. These groups brought with them a deep heritage, language, and perhaps most famously, songs. After the Civil War and emancipation, former slaves settled into their lives while keeping their African customs alive.

Many of the songs sung by laborers have been both preserved and documented by the local Georgia Sea Island Singers. This talented group of performers have been in existence since the 1920s and have performed at the Library of Congress, Carnegie Hall, and the Newport Folk Festival.

The group continues to tour the world today, sharing their songs and memories. Be sure to plan a visit to the Golden Isles in June to enjoy the Georgia Sea Islands Festival, a spirited celebration of African-American food. music and art.

The Golden Isles is part of a larger cultural area known as the Gullah-Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor, which stretches from North Carolina to Jacksonville, Florida. Designated by Congress, one of the core missions of the corridor is to sustain and preserve the land, language, and cultural assets within the coastal communities of South Carolina, Georgia, North Carolina, and Florida. Today, in the preservation and celebration of customs and cultures, there is great recognition of the African-American contributions made to our collective heritage. The African-American cultural experience is heightened and continually enhanced through the talents and works of the African-American writers, artists, performers and business owners who call this area home.



In 1894, Deaconess Alexander became the first African-American ordained as a deacon in the Episcopal Church. She founded Good Shepherd School and Good Shepherd Church, where she faithfully ministered for 53 years and taught African-Americans to read and write. The school and church are located in historic Pennick community in northwest Glynn County.

ROBERT ABBOTT

Born to former slaves on St. Simons Island in 1868, Robert Abbott grew up in nearby Savannah. He pursued an education and career as a lawyer. But as he experienced difficulty in landing a job because of his race, Abbott turned instead to journalism. He founded the Chicago Defender which quickly became the nation's most important African-American newspaper. Abbott used his platform to urge fellow African-Americans to fight for equality. The Defender is believed to have significantly contributed to the Great Migration and the development of a national African-American culture.



St. Simons Island

HISTORIC HARRINGTON SCHOOL CULTURAL CENTER

The last remaining African-American schoolhouse on the Georgia coast, this historic site has been lovingly protected and restored through the efforts of the St. Simons African-American Heritage Coalition, St. Simons Land Trust, Supporters of the Park at Harrington, the Glynn County Commission, and generous community members. Twelve acres surrounding the schoolhouse include walking trails, two ponds with viewing platforms and more.

IGBO LANDING

Pronounced EE-bo, this location has a haunting and grim story during the height of slave trade in the South. Rather than submit to slavery, a captive group of Igbo people (present day Nigeria) drowned themselves in local waters upon arriving on St. Simons Island. The believed site of Igbo Landing is now on private property, but can be seen while crossing Fancy Bluff Creek on Sea Island Road.

FIRST AFRICAN BAPTIST CHURCH

Organized in 1859 at Pikes Bluff & West Point plantations, this is the only surviving African-American church on St. Simons Island that dates back to the plantation era. The original pews can be seen in the balcony. An active congregation still worships at the church each week.

HAMILTON PLANTATION SLAVE CABINS

Two of the few surviving antebellum slave cabins in Georgia, these structures have been carefully preserved by local organizations. Private tours may be scheduled by calling **860.212.2220** or **404.374.3932**.

Jekyll Island

THE WANDERER MEMORY TRAIL

This new, family learning experience moves beyond a dark time in history and brings to light the legacy and influence of the survivors of slavery. The interactive trail follows the story of Umwalla, a young African boy captured by slave traders and smuggled into America via Jekyll Island on one of the last known slave ships.

Brunswick

SELDEN PARK

Originally opened in 1903 as the Selden Normal and Industrial Institute, an education center for African-Americans, the school operated for 30 years before merging with another in Cordele, Georgia. The site reopened as a recreation facility for African-Americans in 1950. The public park still operates today.

HOFWYL-BROADFIELD PLANTATION

Once the site of a prominent rice plantation, this site is now a state historic site. Visitors to the plantation can tour the plantation home built by slave labor, explore the vast grounds, and learn about the history of the plantation era in coastal Georgia.

OAK GROVE CEMETERY

A Victorian Era cemetery established by the city of Brunswick in 1838, it is estimated there are more than 1,200 graves at Oak Grove Cemetery. Prominent African-American residents are buried here, including Captain Douglas Risley who established Risley Colored Memorial School, Brunswick's first public school for African-Americans.



Bessie Jones was a founding member of the famed Georgia Sea Island Singers, a group of African-Americans who used songs and dance to share the history of their families' and ancestors' lives as slaves in coastal Georgia. The group traveled the country and performed at Carnegie Hall, the World's Fair, and even at the 1976 inauguration of President Jimmy Carter.

NEPTUNE SMALL

Neptune was a slave of the King family at Retreat Plantation, and was responsible for looking after the King children. When the Civil War broke out in 1861, Neptune accompanied the third King son, Henry Lord Page King, into service for the Confederacy. King died in the field, and Neptune risked enemy fire to retrieve the son's body. He brought it home

to St. Simons Island, where he was buried at Christ Church's cemetery.

Neptune then returned to the war to serve the youngest King son, until

Confederate forces surrendered in 1865.



THROUGH HEREYES

elebrated Southern author Eugenia Price dedicated much of her literary career to capturing the sights, sounds, charm, and history of Georgia's Golden Isles. Through her novels, she brought to life a stunning setting that many readers had never experienced before. With her St. Simons trilogy as our guide, we've compiled a can't-miss list of landmarks for the novelist's most loyal fans.





LIVE OAK SHOP Start with a visit to the Live Oak Shop in the Golden Isles Welcome Center to pick up the St. Simons Trilogy: "Lighthouse," "New Moon Rising," and "The Beloved Invader." Despite the decades that have unfolded since Price penned these pages, her intoxicating descriptions of the following spots feel timeless, and characters feel like lifelong friends.

CHRIST CHURCH, FREDERICA When you take in the full glory of Christ Church, Frederica, it's hard not to gain a sense of this Episcopal haven's deep-rooted history. Beyond its postcard-like presence, the quaint white chapel, bordered by brilliant greenery and patterned in stained glass, is a window into the St. Simons story.

The parish's first worship service dates back to 1736, when English colonists, led by James Oglethorpe, settled here. Christ Church makes many appearances in each of Price's novels. Given her reverence for the setting, it's only fitting that she was laid to rest in the same cemetery as so many of her characters.

Take time to stroll the grounds, drink in the Gothic architecture, hear a sermon, and visit the cemetery during the free public tour times, Tuesday through Sunday from 2 p.m. - 5 p.m. Christ Church offers daily, weekly, and seasonal opportunities for worship. Visit <code>ccfssi.org</code> for schedules.

\$\frac{1}{2}\$ ST. SIMONS ISLAND LIGHTHOUSE MUSEUM A true hallmark of St. Simons Island is one that pays homage to Eugenia Price herself. The St. Simons Island Lighthouse Museum is settled along the south end of the island in Pier Village.

The museum and gift shop are housed inside the lighthouse's old keepers' dwelling, a picturesque red brick abode that, from behind a white picket fence, anchors the lighthouse. Inside, you'll find an exhibit that highlights "Lighthouse," the first installment in the trilogy. There's also a bevy of rare photographs and artifacts on display around the museum.

The lighthouse itself is as majestic as the author paints it to be. It is the second iteration of the original lighthouse — the one that was born from the vision of James Gould, Price's main character in "Lighthouse" —

which took shape in 1810 but suffered total wreckage during the Civil War. The current tower was reconstructed and reignited in 1872. Crafted in Savannah gray brick, the tower stands 104 feet tall and is among only five lighthouses that remain in the state of Georgia.

Get your camera ready and climb the 129 steps to the top. You'll enjoy unparalleled views of the Island's south end, nearby Jekyll Island, and Brunswick. Tours of the lighthouse and museum are Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. $-5\,\mathrm{p.m.}$ and Sunday from 1:30 p.m. $-5\,\mathrm{p.m.}$

CANNON'S POINT PRESERVE From there, journey with character James Gould from the lighthouse on the south end of the island to Cannon's Point on the north end. Once a Native American homestead, the treasured land on Cannon's Point was purchased by John Couper in 1793. He transformed the sandy plot bordering the Hampton River into a cotton plantation. You can visit the plantation's ruins by making a five-mile trek from the Cannon's Point Preserve parking lot, where a kiosk provides maps. Among the ruins, you'll find 19th-

Cannon's Point Preserve is open Saturday, Sunday, and Monday from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Gascoigne Bluff Afterwards, end your adventure at one of the most serene spots on St. Simons Island's western side. Gascoigne Bluff, which overlooks the Frederica River, is truly a marvel of self-reinvention. It began as a Native American community, then as a port for ships entering the harbor. It's been a naval base, the site of a Franciscan monastery, a slave plantation and cotton stronghold, and eventually, a hub for transporting lumber and timber. It was also here that James Gould felled oaks to construct warships for the Navy.

Visitors can enjoy the beauty of Gascoigne Bluff's public park. Make your way to the fishing pier, where marshland meets the Frederica River, to soak up a Georgian sunset. If you peer across the water, you can spy three small islands that formed from ballast discarded by ships dating back to the 18th century.

AWHALE OF A TALE

An incredible story of visitors and residents coming together to save the day.

It's true when we say some of the most beautiful and rare wildlife can be found in the Golden Isles. From finding a live sand dollar burrowing itself in the wet sand, or watching a bald eagle or an osprey soar high above the shore in search of their next meal, there's something so special about spotting, identifying and sometimes even encountering wildlife, especially when it's in their natural habitat.

In July 2019, beachgoers at East Beach on St. Simons Island were in for quite a big surprise. At first, what appeared to be a pod of bottlenose dolphins began swimming parallel to the shoreline. But as the group got closer, it was apparent this was an animal much larger than the bottlenose dolphins we know and love. In all, a pod of about

50 pilot whales swam closer and closer to shore and began to surface on the beaches of St. Simons Island.

Commonly referred to as a mass stranding, when large groups of marine mammals attempt to strand themselves, the outcome can be downright devastating and heart-wrenching. In fact, the last recorded pilot whale strandings in coastal Georgia occurred between 1955-1977 and left well over 100 whales dead. "This gives you the context of how this could have turned out differently if the community hadn't been there," remarks Clay George, senior wildlife biologist for the Georgia Department of Natural Resources.

As fate would have it, it seemed as if the stars aligned and the





circumstances of this particular summer evening on St. Simons turned out to be a best-case scenario. Between the incoming tide and the number of beachgoers on site lending a hand, nearly all of the whales were able to return safely to deeper waters.

Typically when marine mammals strand, they're alone, and they're sick or injured," says George. "But pilot whales are so social — if even one member of the pod gets sick, the rest of the whales can follow it straight off the cliff." And follow they did: Pilot whales normally live in deep water 80 miles or more from the Georgia coast.

Thanks to the quick decision making and expertise of first responders onsite, the group was able to quickly identify the individual whales that were unwell and separate them from the rest of the group. "Cases like this are tough because you know most of the whales are probably healthy. We don't want to see any animals die, but to lose only three out of fifty is unheard of," says George.

Brooke Ledford, vacationing from Tennessee with her family, recalls the incredible experience she and her family had, calling it "the best vacation ever!" The Ledford family has been visiting the Golden Isles for over six years, coming twice each year with their children. "We originally planned this trip because we wanted to witness the sea turtles hatching. We didn't get to see sea turtles; we saw whales instead!"

The family was enjoying a late afternoon out on East Beach when the whales began to appear and quickly approached the shallow shore. "All of a sudden, it kicked in what was going on," recalls Ledford. "Old, young, men, women, kids — everyone gave it their all to help the whales.



Everyone was working together to save them."

Brooke and her teenage daughter worked alongside other visitors and island residents alike to keep the whales in the water. Under normal circumstances, the Department of Natural Resources would never encourage bystanders to interact with stranded wildlife, but this was a very special situation, said Clay George. "If people hadn't come together quickly to help, there could have been a very different outcome."

What started as a casual and relaxing afternoon on a St. Simons Island beach turned into a once-in-a-lifetime experience with memories to last forever. "At one point, I leaned down toward the head of one of the whales. It looked right at me, and it was as if they knew we were trying to help," said Ledford. "It was the most awesome experience!"

Toward the end of the incident, Clay George reflected on the series of events. "Once things had settled down, the sun was setting and this big pod of pilot whales was swimming in the [St. Simons] Sound right off the Pier. There were all these people watching, and it was really beautiful."

But there are still a lot of unknowns: What caused this? Would the whales try to strand again? While so many details continue to remain a mystery, officials were heartened to learn the same pod of pilot whales was spotted five days later, swimming south off the coast of Florida.

"It was a combination of really lucky things that resulted in most of the animals making it. It's an incredibly positive story. If the circumstances had been different, dozens of whales could have met their end on the beach that night," recalls George.



OF GOLD

If you play golf...at any level... Sea Island should be on your bucket list.

ith so much terrific golf to choose from, the Golden Isles could just as easily be called the Green Isles. Throughout the region, beautiful courses wind through marshes and majestic oaks, look out on jaw-dropping views, host native wildlife, and offer exciting challenges to every level of golfer.

The area's original holes were recently treated to an ingenious renovation. The Plantation Course at Sea Island—half of which dates back to 1928—reopened last fall after a graceful redesign conducted by PGA Tour star Davis Love III and his brother, Mark. The Love brothers grew up on Sea Island, which gave the project added significance. "Since we were working on our home course, there was a little extra trepidation," explained Mark, who lived in his mother's house on the back nine while overseeing the work. "We've been looking out at and playing this course most of our lives, thinking about what we could do with it."

What they did was tie the two nines a little more closely together while restoring some of the features of the original architects: Walter Travis (1928) on the front nine, Dick Wilson (1960) on the back. The greens are large and full of subtle movement, and, particularly on the front, squareshaped. The bunkers also have straight edges—a throwback feature Davis wanted to work in wherever possible—and while there are still some 80 hazards to be negotiated, they are smaller and flatter than before, greatly reducing the overall amount of sand. As a result, the course is fun and welcoming, especially off the tee.

It's also lovely to look at. Trees were trimmed, opening up the vistas across Plantation and onto the adjacent Seaside Course. A number of holes play along water, and golfers enjoying late afternoon rounds will be





treated to a glorious sunset over St. Simons Sound.

While Sea Island was recapturing golf history, it also was looking to the future with the creation of the state-of-the-art Golf Performance Center (GPC). The GPC recently moved into its new home, a classically designed, 17,000-square-foot two-story building that sits along the expansive Plantation/Seaside practice facility. There are dedicated hitting areas outside and bays inside that open up onto the range with stunning views across the water.

The new GPC brings all the elements of golf instruction together—long game, short game, putting, fitness, club fitting, and the mental game—with a staff of 10 full-time teachers, 4 club fitters, and 2 fitness trainers. From capturing a golfer's motion in 3-D to specialized putting platforms, these expert teachers have the latest technology on hand—and even underfoot, where special plates in the floor measure pressure and weight shift during the swing.

The GPC is set up to give every golfer a TOUR-like experience, from juniors and beginners up through professionals, offering coaching to club fitting. It should come as no surprise that many of the

PGA Tour players who live nearby use the facility and work with the very same teachers to keep their games sharp.

On Sea Island and throughout the Golden Isles, the game's traditions and future exist comfortably side by side.

Home on the Green

n recent years, a growing number of pro golfers have chosen to live, train or play in the Golden Isles. And the reasons are obvious. Exquisite courses. Incomparable training and instruction. A chance to learn from some of the game's greatest instructors.

Combine that with a supportive, family-friendly community, mild climate with lots of outdoor activities, and a serene, laid-back lifestyle. That's a perfect round.

"For a pro golfer, this area has so much going for it, we don't have to recruit anyone to live here," said Brannen Veal, Sea Island's Director of Golf. "Between the world-class instruction and playing so often with their peers, they can continue to raise their game. Plus, it's a great family environment. People here are genuine and welcoming."

aith has been a stronghold in the Golden Isles since its settlement. In fact, churches were some of the earliest public buildings in St. Simons Island. Gothic-style Christ Church, Frederica was the first; and its continuous worship in the parish since 1736 makes it one of the oldest churches in the state. First African Missionary Baptist Church was organized in 1859, and the oldest standing church building on St. Simons Island is Lovely Lane Chapel at Epworth by the Sea, built in 1880. From stained-glass windows to soaring steeples, the area's 30-plus houses of worship are markers of architecture. But more importantly, they're welcoming sanctuaries for Golden Isles worshippers.



Transportation

The Golden Isles, situated on Georgia's southeast Atlantic coast, is approximately 75 miles south of Savannah, Georgia; 65 miles north of Jacksonville, Florida; and 280 miles southeast of Atlanta, Georgia.

Enjoy easy access by automobile via I-95 (from the north or the south), or U.S. Highways 341, 25, 82, and 520 (from the west). You can also travel to the Golden Isles by train (Jesup) or by bus (Brunswick).

Convenient commercial air service is available to Brunswick Golden Isles Airport (BQK), just 20 minutes from the barrier islands.

Meanwhile, Jacksonville's JAX and Savannah's SAV are only a one hour drive via I-95.
